1992

TEDC Board votes to support 4-year status for UT Tyler

TEDC President, Tom Mullins, is elected to serve as Chairman for the North East Texas Economic Developers Roundtable

1993

TEDC awarded Lone Star City designation Assisted in the creation of 868 jobs to date

1994

John Soules Foods to build new 60,000 SF facility on FM 14; 85 employees, now 742

Tyler Industrial Foundation dissolved, TEDC board accepts gift of assets; Tyler Industrial Park

1995

Target chooses Tyler/Lindale for 1st distribution center in Texas; 1,000 jobs, \$95 million investment

1997

Tyler & Lindale are awarded the Texas EDC Community Economic Development Award (CEDA) for the Target Distribution Center project

Assisted in the creation of 4,182 jobs to date 1999

Classic Cable (Suddenlink/Altice USA) chooses Tyler for expansion; 200 jobs, now 1,500

TEDC is the first International EDC Accredited Economic Development Organization (AEDO) in Texas

Tax Increment Financing district created for the TJC West Campus Skills Training Center

The East Texas Economic Development District presents TEDC with the Regional Economic Development Award

2003

Loop 49 construction begins

2008

TEDC acquires property for the Tyler Business & Technology Park, south of Earl Campbell Parkway

2018

Hiland Dairy chooses Tyler milk plant for a \$45 million expansion/renovation; 80 new jobs

Wyoming Machinery – CAT chooses Tyler for new Dragline Services Specialties division, one of two in the US; 88 new jobs, \$17 million investment

Tyler, Lindale, and Mineola win the Texas EDC CEDA award for the Sanderson Farms Project

Tyler, Lindale, and Mineola win the International EDC Silver award for regionalism and cross border collaboration on the Sanderson Farms Project

TEDC received AEDO reaccreditation. TEDC is the second longest accredited organization in North America, 20 years running

In 2018, TEDC had 3 continuing loan projects.












